# Intérieurs 

Intérieur 'a', Intérieur 'b', and Intérieur 'c' may be played in any order. After each section has been performed once one of the three should be repeated.

The position of a section in the sequence affects its tempo; the later it comes, the slower the tempo marking:
Movement 1: Intérieur 'a'-d=120c. / Intérieur 'b'-d=140c. / Intérieur 'c'-d=160c.
Movement 2: Intérieur 'a' $\downarrow=90 c$. / Intérieur 'b'-d= 105c. / Intérieur 'c'-d = 115c.
Movement 3: Intérieur 'a' $\downarrow=70 \mathrm{c}$. / Intérieur 'b'- $\downarrow=70 \mathrm{c}$. / Intérieur ' $\mathbf{c}$ '- $\downarrow=80 \mathrm{oc}$.
Movement 4: Intérieur 'a' $\downarrow=60 \mathrm{c} /$ Intérieur 'b' $-\boldsymbol{d}=60 \mathrm{c}$. / Intérieur ' $\mathbf{c}$ ' $-\boldsymbol{d}=50 \mathrm{c}$.

When a section is repeated as the final movement there are one or two additional changes:
Intérieur 'a'-d=60c. - play an octave lower than written - sempre ppp
Intérieur 'b'-d = 60c. - play an octave lower than written
Intérieur 'c'-d = 50c. - con ®̧od. throughout - sempre ppp
